September 14th The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Today we celebrate the exaltation of the cross of Christ, for on its wood Jesus took upon himself all our sin and the evil of our world, and vanquished them by his love. That is why we celebrate today's Feast. The word of God that we heard today tells us how, by contrasting serpents that bite with a serpent that saves we reflect on these two images. First, the *serpents that bite* attacked the people who had fallen once more into the sin of speaking against God. On a deep level, they had grown discouraged, lost hope and lacked the strength to believe that the Lord Himself was guiding them towards a land of plenty. This first part of the narrative asks us to examine those moments in our own personal lives when our trust in the Lord and one another has failed. How often have we grown dry, disheartened and impatient in our own personal deserts, and lost sight of our journey's goal! The second image: the *serpent that saves* reveals to us God's way of dealing with evil, sin and distrust on the part of humanity. Then, as now, in the great spiritual battle that continues throughout history, God does not destroy the vile and worthless things that men and women choose to pursue. From the heights of the cross, we can view our life and the history of our peoples in a new way. For from the cross of Christ we learn love, not hatred; compassion, not indifference; forgiveness, not vengeance. The outstretched arms of Jesus are the embrace of tender love with which God wishes to embrace us.

Jesus, help me to forgive.

MATTHEW 18:15-20



As Jesus was giving Peter the keys to the kingdom and establishing him as leader of the Church, he was also giving Peter a specific ministry that came with a special authority and grace: the power to bind and loose. While we are not priests who hear confessions, we are all called to forgive. Jesus wants us to understand that both our forgiveness and our failure to forgive have an effect on people. By our words and the thoughts in our hearts, we can keep someone bound in condemnation or judgement. But, we can “loose” them by forgiving them. This means that we can help them experience the freedom that Jesus wants for them. We can continue His “ministry of reconciliation” in our corner of the world. Jesus knows the danger that sin poses to our souls. That is why He urges us to “cut off” and “throw away” anything in our lives that leads us astray. Jesus never stops seeking after His lost sheep. He calls us to forgive “seventy-seven times from our heart”. Because we forgive people who sin against us, we won’t just be freeing them, we’ll be “loosing” ourselves from those chains, too. *“Jesus, help me to forgive today.”*

Catechists are people who keep the memory of God alive; they keep it alive in themselves and they are able to revive it in others.

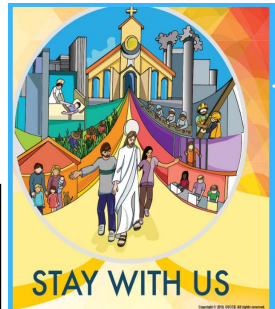
