#### September 29th Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

This feast of the archangels reminds us that physical things are only a small part of reality and that we cannot pretend to know and understand everything Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or mes-

senger of God. Angels are celestial or heavenly beings, on a higher order than human beings. Angels have no bodies and do not depend on matter for their existence or activity. They are distinct from saints, which men can become. Angels have intellect and will and are immortal. They are a vast multitude, but each is a person. Archangels are one of the nine choirs of angels listed in the Bible. In ascending order, the choirs or classes are 1) Angels, 2) Archangels, 3) Principalities, 4) Powers, 5) Virtues, 6) Dominations, 7) Thrones, 8) Cherubim, and 9) Seraphim. Angels are not imaginary but real beings with different tasks to perform. Michael is given the task of defending us against the forces of darkness and evil. Raphael cures our wounds and sicknesses. Gabriel is the great messenger of God. The feast of the archangels invites each of us to deepen our faith in them; the protection and the help that we continue to get from these angels should prompt us to honor them and be grateful to them. Let us also become 'angels' in the lives of others.

#### LIFE IS NOT FAIR! PRAISE GOD!

### **September 24, 2023**

### **MATTHEW 20:1-16A**



The gospel reading today challenges us to shift our understanding of fairness from a limited human viewpoint to God's unlimited generosity. Jesus is emphasizing that God's kingdom operates on principles different from the world's standards. He calls us to let go of our sense of entitlement and to appreciate God's graciousness towards all who respond to His call. It prompts us to see that God's ways transcend our notions and that His grace can not be earned or measured by our efforts. I This message should encourages us not to resent the inclusion of those we see as unworthy, but to celebrate the boundless mercy that God extends to us all. The equal payment of all of the workers highlights God's boundless

grace and it shows that salvation is a gift offered to everyone regardless of their background, past deeds, or the time they come to faith. Just as the landowner seeks laborers throughout the day, God's grace is available to all, regardless of then they turn to Him. It's a reminder that God's compassion exceeds our expectations, inviting us to find joy in this truth.

Beyond its spiritual implications, this parable also prompts us to reflect on the dignity of labor. Just as each worker in the parable deserves fair treatment, all individuals merit just wages and meaningful work. This principle underscores the value of equitable compensation and the right for everyone to earn a living wage. Recognizing that our labor reflects our dignity encourages us to ensure that everyone has the chance to support themselves and their families through dignified employment. Rather than comparing ourselves to others, the parable encourages a focus on promoting the well-being of all. Supporting wage earners and families becomes an embodiment of a truly prolife stance, as it nurtures the conditions for a fulfilling and self-sufficient life. This resonates with the essence of faith-extending care and compassion to those in need.
