Saint Martin de Porres, Religious November 3rd - Patron Saint of Harmony



St. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru in 1579. His father, Juan de Porres, was a Spanish soldier and nobleman born in Burgos, Spain who came to the "new world" as Governor of Panama. Martin's mother, Anna Velázquez was a black freed woman from Panama. There was no question of marriage because Anna's skin was black.

Apprenticed as a barber-doctor at the age of 12, he entered the Dominican Order a few years later as a lay brother. In 1603 Martin made his vows as a full-fledged Dominican Brother, with the vocation of prayer and work.

Advancing quickly to the highest level of spirituality (it is believed by 20 years of age), he passed the remainder of his life in complete dedication to his order and to the cause of the poor and sick of Lima.

St Martin is famous for his miracles, which include multiplying food to help feed the monks and the poor. Many miracles of healing were attributed to his intercession. St. Martin did extreme penance and spent long hours in prayer. The life of St. Martin de Porres is explanation enough why he is so powerful with God and such a certain helper in time of need.

He died November in 1639, a few days short of his sixtieth birthday. The highest dignitaries, both civil and religious, were his pallbearers. Everyone wanted to honor this holy man. The whole city of Lima mourned.

The appeal of St. Martin de Porres is universal. Called an apostle of charity; patron of social justice; father of the sick and the poor; wonder worker of Peru; and helper in hopeless cases, he is a powerful intercessor to those in need.

In 1962, His Holiness, Pope John XXIII presented him to the world as the Saint of Universal Brotherhood. Holy Mother Church celebrates the feast of Saint Martin de Porres on November 3rd. He is the first person of color to be canonized in the Western Hemisphere.

LOVING GOD AND NEIGHBOR

MATTHEW 22: 34-40



“You shall love the Lord....You shall love your neighbor.”

Why are those two commandments the greatest? Because they encapsulate everything that God had spoken about to Moses and the Israelites. As Jesus told the Pharisees, “The whole law and the prophets depend” on them.

As important as these two commandments are, however, we might be tempted to think they’re impossible to follow. That’s because too often, we associate love only with warm and fuzzy feelings. But love goes beyond emotion and is sometimes even independent of it. In other words, it’s not so much what we feel as how we act.

Today’s first reading shows us that to love our neighbor, especially the most vulnerable among us, we must act justly toward them. These laws, given to Moses by God himself, may have been what

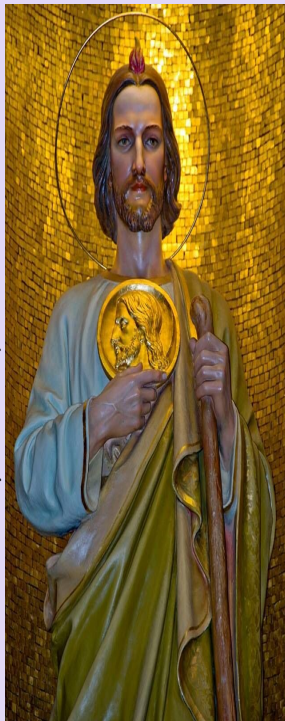
Jesus had in mind when He was talking to the Pharisees that day. Jesus knew that in order to love someone, we don’t have to necessarily feel an emotional connection. We don’t even have to know them personally. But we do need to care for them and make sure they are being treated justly.

The same is true in our relationship with the Lord. We might be going through a dry spell in our prayer time. Maybe we don’t even have the desire to pray. But when we make time to be with Jesus, whatever our feelings at that moment, we are loving Him.

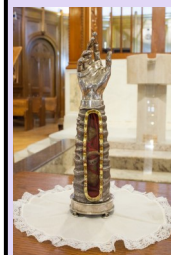
Each day, whether you wake up feeling energetic and cheerful or tired and cross, you will be presented with opportunities to love God and your neighbor in concrete ways. Don’t pass them up! By itself, each specific action you take might not seem particularly noteworthy. Maybe you don’t feel any love as you do them. But in fact, when you extend yourself for another time and again, you are doing exactly what God called you to do.

Jesus, help me see how I can love you and my neighbor today.”
