Saints John Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests



When the Jesuits in France decided to begin a mission to bring the Word of God to the indigenous peoples of New France, or present-day Canada, the newly ordained Fr. Jean de Brébeuf (1593-1649) was ready. He arrived in the territory of the Huron (Wendat) people in 1626. For twenty years he labored and lived among this people, compiling the first dictionary of their language, and writing a catechism in

Wendat. Echon, or "he who carries a heavy load," the Hurons called him. Some of them accepted baptism. Gradually, others joined the mission including the Jesuit Fr. Isaac Jogues (1607-1646). The Iroquois Confederacy, at war with the Hurons, saw the French missionaries as allies of their enemies. Fr. Isaac Jogues was captured, tortured, and several of his fingers cut off so that he could not celebrate Mass. A slave for over a year, he was ransomed, returned to France and received a dispensation allowing him to celebrate Mass with mutilated hands. In 1646, Fr. Jogues returned to New France, tried to negotiate a peace treaty and was killed. Fr. Jean de Brébeuf was kidnapped in the present-day province of Québec the following year, after managing to warn some of the Huron villagers that enemy warriors were near. The martyrdom that Fr. de Brébeuf had vowed not to escape had come, and it was interminable. Fr. de Brébeuf prayed for the courage to suffer without crying out, for the sake of the warriors inflicting these sufferings. They valued courage, and he did not want them to think that Christians were weak. So impressed were they that when he died, they ate his heart so as to obtain a share in his bravery. Later, Isaac Jogues' killer would ask for baptism.

The kingdom of heaven
may be likened to a king
who gave a wedding feast*
for his son. – Jesus
(Matthew 22:2)

This is a sobering parable. None of us want to end up like those villagers who were victims of the violence they had inflicted on the king's servants, and we certainly don't want to be like that poorly dressed wedding guest. So how should we respond?

Jesus told this parable to the chief priests and Pharisees of Jerusalem who had been trying to destroy him. Despite the malice he encountered on their part, Jesus loved them deeply. Then he told them a discordant story to warn them of the harsh consequences if they continued down the path of disbelief and hatred. He wanted them to find their way to his kingdom, just as so many “tax collectors and sinners” had done.

Jesus wants everyone to enter his kingdom. His invitation is open to both his enemies and his disciples “both evil and good.” He welcomes all who come to Him with humility, faith and repentance. When you come, He showers you with mercy. He heals your wounds and gives you peace. He removes all your sins and gives you a seat of

honor at his banquet table.

Choosing the kingdom is not done all at once. It is a continuous vocation. Today and every day you will find many invitations from the Lord. They will come through the people you interact with: will you love them as Christ does? They will come when you read the headlines: will you intercede for all the suffering in the world? They will come when you spot opportunities to share your faith: will you bear witness to the Lord, whether through your words or actions? You are among the “many” guests. Choose Jesus!
