Saint Peter Canisius, **Priest and Doctor of the Church** December 21st

Peter was born in Holland in 1521, and attended university in Cologne, Germany, earning a master's degree by the time he was 19. He then decided to join the Society of Jesus-the Jesuits. St. Ignatius of Loyola served as his spiritual director, and he dedicated his efforts to preaching

and developed as a scholar and administrator in universities. During Mass one day, Peter received a vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which moved him to focus his work on this perspective of divine love. He wrote about the experience in a letter: "It was as if you opened to me the heart of your most sacred body: I seemed to see it directly before my eyes. You told me to drink from the fountain inviting me, that is, to draw the waters of my Savior. I was most eager that streams of faith, hope and love should flow into me from that source. I was thirsting for poverty, chastity, obedience. I asked to be made wholly clean by you, to be clothed by you, to be made resplendent by you."

Peter taught at many universities, but devoted great efforts to preaching so that he could explain the fundamental truths of Catholic teaching from the pulpit. His work had an immediate impact on Catholics there. He founded colleges at Munich (1559), Innsbruk (1562), Dillingen (1563), Wúrzburg, (1567), Augsburg, and Vienna, and even recommended St. Stanislaus Kostka for reception in the Jesuits. He was a strong opponent of Protestantism and has been called the second apostle of Germany. His major work was the Triple Catechism (1555-58), which became the most famous catechism of the Counter-Reformation. He is known for his strong support for the Catholic faith during the Protestant reformation in Germany. Austria, Bohemia, Moravia, Switzerland, and the British Isles.




ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS! AGAIN I SAY, REJOICE!

JOHN 1:6-8,19-28



When St. Paul tells us to :rejoice always" (1 Thessalonians 5:16), it might seem that he is asking the impossible. How can we always feel joyful? isn't this too much to ask, even today, on Gaudete (or :Rejoice:) Sunday?

Not according to St. Thomas Aquinas! He taught that "joy is caused by love". As we experience God's love for us, we grow in love for him-and this exchange of love is what produces joy in us. St. Paul also knew that God's love was the secret to joy, which is why he follows up his exhortation to "rejoice always" with specific steps that we can take to experience his love more deeply:

First, pray with ceasing. When we open our heart to God throughout the day, he fills it with his very self. The experience of his unconditional love and unending mercy ignites our love in return.

Second, in all circumstances give thanks (Thessalonians 5:18). Gratitude also deepens our love for God, especially when we reflection who he is and what he has done for us. And in this Advent season, whatever our circumstances, we can thank God for sending his Son to earth to become one of us.

Finally, do not quench the Spirit (1 Thessalonians 5:19). In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul tells us that "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit". If we want more joy in our lives, we can ask the Spirit to stir up the love of God in our hearts. And when he does, we can express it by praising him-which in turn, increase our joy.

Joy is not jus for Gaudete Sunday; it's for every day. So each day, follow Paul's advice: turn to the Lord in prayer, thank him for all he has done for you, and ask him to fill you with more of his Spirit. Then praise him-and let your spirit soar



The Third Candle is Pink and stands for Joy. It is called "the Shepherd's Candle," and the shepherds' section of the Christmas story is very much about joy. It represents the joy that filled the hearts of the shepherds when they journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the Wise men. The third week of Advent is unique, more spontaneous, and celebratory compared to the other weeks.
