





#### SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI, VIRGIN **NOVEMBER 13th**



Born in a small town southeast of Milan, Italy on July 15, 1850, Cabrini's original name was Maria Francesca Cabrini, before she took her vows in 1877 and changed her name to Frances Xavier, in tribute to Francis Xavier. Before becoming a nun, she was a teacher who, being taught by the Daughters of the Sacred Heart, earned a teaching certificate in 1868. It is said that she had aquaphobia because she nearly drowned as a child but she overcame it as an adult making 23 transatlantic trips to do missionary work around the world. Due to her frail health, Cabrini had to create her own mis-

sionary because of pervious rejections. In 1880, at the age of 30, Cabrini founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with seven other young women in Lodi, Italy. Although Cabrini really wanted to go to China, Pope Leo XIII told her "not to the East, but to the West"-to New York for her missionary trip. She landed in New York in 1889 where pre-arranged accommodations were not ready and it was suggested she return to Italy. The American Sisters of Charity gave them hospitality and the Italian Countess of Cesnola later donated the property near 59th Street which became their home and later the site of the order's orphanage which opened on Palm Sunday 1890. In her lifetime Cabrini established sixty-seven institutions—one for each year of her life. Her orphanages, hospitals and schools are located throughout the United States in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Chicago, Louisiana, Mississippi, Illinois, Colorado, California, Washington State and in Argentina, Spain and France.

Mother Cabrini has four miracles attributed to her intercession, two in 1928 and two in 1939, which helped her become a canonized saint. She became the first U.S. citizen to be come a canonized saint on July 7, 1946.

So then let us not sleep, as do the rest, but let us

In Jesus' time, weddings were events to be anticipated: seven days of nonstop feasting and celebrating. So we can assume that all of the ten young women in today's parable wanted to go to this particular wedding feast. And yet, when the bridegroom was delayed, five of them were not ready. Their lamps died out, and they had no oil to refill them.

Who knows why they weren't prepared? Maybe they were distracted or too busy to make sure their oil flasks were full. But what we do know is that, as a result, they were not where they were supposed to be, and they missed the chance to come into the feast. What a shame! These young women seriously needed to reexamine their priorities!

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the Church uses our Mass readings to encourage us to examine our own priorities as we await the coming of the Lord. We have been invited to the wedding feast of Jesus, when His Bride, the Church, will be united to Him forever. Of course we

want to go!

That means we need to make sure our lamps have enough oil. We need to heed Jesus' last words from today's Gospel: "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour". But it's not about going to a store to stock up on supplies. Staying awake means looking at how we spend our time and making sure that we're putting the Lord first and cultivating our love for Jesus, our Bridegroom.

Look back over this past week. Think about the decisions you make and how they reveal what is important to you. Is there one priority you could reshape that would help you be closer to where you need to be when the Bridegroom returns?

"Jesus, thank you for inviting me to your wedding feast! Help me to be ready for you"!




