October 11th Saint John XXIII, Pope "The Good Pope"

Giovanni Battista Ronalli was born on November 25, 1881. Admired because he was 'simple and active," John XXIII's papacy was

defined by carrying out "Christian duties" including visiting the imprisoned and the sick, as well as widening the Church's horizons from a simple request to only be referred to as "the Pope" in writeups, to making sure that every side of the world was represented in the College of Cardinals, appointing its first members from Japan, Africa, and even the Philippines, in the person of Rufino Cardinal Santos, former archbishop of Manila. But his biggest contribution to the Roman Catholic Church was summoning the first ecumenical cycle in nearly a century. Barely three months into being pope, John XXIII "shocked the world" when he announced the creation of the Second Vatican Council (or Vatican II) in January 1959. The endeavor included rumors on revising canon law to keep up with the times, as well as the use of vernacular language for sacraments instead of the traditional Latin. Significant changes in officiating Mass were also included, with the priest facing the congregation instead of the altar. However, he was not around to witness the completion of what became of his papal legacy, succumbing to stomach cancer in 1963, before the second session of the council.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

This is one of Jesus' hardest parables. This is not a parable of forgiveness and love but of the truth of our faith. This parable is warning us not to take anything for granted. Our mission is to serve others and live the best we can. Our world, our life, our salvation - it is all grace, all a gift from God. We work hard, making our living and providing for ourselves and our family, and its easy to forget that everything that we have is not ours, but the Lords. Whether or not we share the fruits of our harvest with those in need, we will probably not be struck down by lightning. Whether or not we are nice to our neighbors this week, we will probably not receive a visit from the owner of the vineyard to receive consequences. And whether or not we have lived selfishly this week, we probably won't notice any immediate consequences from our Heavenly Father. But, then again, none of us are guaranteed tomorrow. Since today is all that we can be certain of, why would we put off living faithfully as God's steward until tomorrow, if we can do it today? Why would

we tempt God to take the Kingdom of God away from us, and give it to a people who will produce the fruits of the kingdom, as Jesus warns us in the gospel reading? Why would we do that? There can really only be one reason - we would do this only if we believe that the landowner would never return. When it comes right down to it, this is a parable about faith, about the importance of believing that God is very real. This world is a vineyard that is not owned by us. We have a landowner who has entrusted us with it, and will one day hold us accountable to this trust. Our God is very real, and sent us God's only beloved Son, Jesus, not just to check on the vineyard, but to die for us, and for the sins of all the world. And after he died on the cross, he was raised from the dead and sits at the right hand of the Father. And one day He will come again to judge the living and the dead. To check on His vineyard, to see what we have done with the place, and to receive the fruit of our labor. He calls us to bear fruit for the kingdom of God or it shall be taken from us, just like the tenants of the vineyard. In layman's terms, if we don't do His will we risk never knowing the splendor of Heaven. This is really scary to think about. We are called to be perfection, though perfection is impossible. Our mission is to serve others and live as best we can. For me, this story is a reminder to never become a lazy Catholic. We have all been there, thinking we don't have to go to church or we don't have to forgive those who have wronged us. This can lead us astray from God and our humanity. Sometimes we need a reminder of what happens when we aren't vigilant and always living for our fellow humans. This story is one of those reminders. Let this gospel light a fire under your heart to do more than you are because our work is never done. We must constantly ask ourselves the Vincentian question: What must be done?
