October 11th Saint John XXIII, Pop "The Good Pope"

Admired because he was "simple and active," John XXIII's papacy was defined by carrying out "Christian duties" including visiting the imprisoned and the sick, as well as widening the Church's

horizons-from a simple request to only be referred to as "the Pope" in write-ups, to making sure that every side of the world was represented in the College of Cardinals, appointing its first members from Japan, Africa, and even the Philippines, in the person of Rufino Cardinal Santos, former archbishop of Manila. But his biggest contribution to the Roman Catholic Church was summoning the first ecumenical cycle in nearly a century. Barely three months into being pope, John XXIII "shocked the world" when he announced the creation of the Second Vatican Council (or Vatican II) in January 1959. The endeavor included remorms on revising canon law to keep up with the times, as well as the use of vernacular language for sacraments instead of the traditional Latin. Significant changes in officiating Mass were also included, with the priest facing the congregation instead of the altar.

CHANGE MY HEART, OH GOD!

October 1. 2023

MATTHEW 21:33-43



The gospel reading today reflects on the importance of genuine, heartfelt repentance. It emphasizes that actions speak louder than words, and that actively following God takes more effort than just claiming to follow Him. It also reminds us that ignoring worldly challenges is not unique. This parable encourages us to practice our faith as a way of becoming closer to both God and the world around us. Those who refuse God but later repent and obey, like the first son, will go into the kingdom. And they will go in before those who say yes, but don't obey God, like the second son.

John the Baptist come preaching repentance. Jesus came preaching repentance. The early disciples came preaching repentance. The

Gospel is always about change. But the Gospel is about more that just change: It is about transformation—about being changed to be more like God, displaying all the qualities of the Spirit's work in us (2 Corinthians 2:18; "And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit"¹, and Galatians 5:22-23; "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law). That kind of change requires the power of the Holy Spirit. While polite words and appearances are important for Christians, God is really concerned about our genuine heartfelt repentance. To repent means to change both our hearts and our lives. One without the other is incomplete.

Prayer: Almighty and loving God, please be patient with me and help me to be more impatient with my weaknesses as Your Spirit seeks to do His work of transformation in my life. Please give me the wisdom to know your will, courage to stay away from sin and a willing heart to seek after You. Amen.
