

Saint Stephen, The First Martyr December 26th

December 24, 2023

Stephen was one of the first to follow the Apostles. It is believed that he was either Greek, or a Jew educated in Greek culture. What is curtain is that he was greatly preciated by the community in Jerusalem that his name appears first among the seven men chosen as deacons to assist the Apostles in their

mission. A man "filled with faith and the Holy Spirit", he worked wonders and miracles-but some members of the synagogue stirred up the people against him, with the elders and scribes saying he had blasphemed against Moses and against God. In the days following Pentecost, Stephen was hauled before the Sanhedrim, and accused by false witnesses of preaching that Jesus would "destroy this place and change the customs that Moses handed down to us."

Saint Stephen then gave a speech-the longest recorded in the Acts of the Apostles –in which he reviewed the history of salvation. God, he said, had prepared for the coming of Jesus, the Righteous One, but the leaders of the people had resisted the Holy Spirit just as their fathers had persecuted the prophets. Stephen concluded his speech with the words, "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right had of God." This final proclamation cost him dearly. With a loud cry, those present cast him out of the city "and began to stone him."

The Acts of the Apostles says that among those who approved of Stephen's execution was Saul, who persecuted the Christians, but later became the Apostle of the Gentiles-St. Paul. As he breathed his last, St. Stephen, in imitation of Jesus, prayed that God might receive his spirit, and prayed for the forgiveness for his murderers.

Mary's words to the angel an seem easy and somewhat romantic to us. But to her they were anything but. They represented a seismic shift in her life. When she spoke these words, she was agreeing to take up a mysterious new life filled with a host of unknowns. No longer would she be a humble housewife and mother in the model of so many of the women she had known.

Instead, she would become the Mother of God, and nothing would ever be the same. She would have only one child whom she would prepare to become Israel's Messiah and the Savior of the world. What's more, she would go through life bearing the misunderstanding and judgements of friends and family members.

Imagine how frightening this could have been for Mary. She had no example to follow because nothing like this had ever happened before! She couldn't ask her mother or an aunt to show her how to walk this path. Her rabbi might offer some guidance, but the idea that

God even had a Son would have been foreign to him.

But as unique as Mary's situation was, it is also very familiar. Who among us hasn't felt at times as if we were walking a path that no one else has walked? Who hasn't felt at times as if we were all alone, with no one to guide us? We may not have responded as sinlessly as Mary did, but just the fact that she has gone before us can bring us great comfort.

Mary knows what its like to have her life turned upside down. She knows what it's like to walk a lonely roadand to be misunderstood. But even on Christmas Eve, as she faced the prospect of giving birth in a stable, sh continued to trust in God's care. Now assumed into heaven, she offers us her compassion, support, and intercession, especially when we feel lost and alone. She never tires of teaching us and caring for us


