## The Presentation of the Lord February 2nd

Jesus' presentation in the Temple reflects how he fulfills the Old Covenant. According to Old Testament law, a sacrifice had to be offered in the temple when a child was consecrated to the Lord. Mary and Joseph honor this tradition (Luke 2:22-24).

Pope John Paul II wrote, "God enters the temple not as a powerful ruler but as a little child in his Mother's arms. The King of Glory comes not with a show of human force and power, not with a great fanfare and noise, not causing fright and destruction. He comes as he came into the world, as an infant in silence, in poverty, and in the company of the poor and the wise."

## Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr February 3rd



Saint Blaise was of noble birth and was educated in the Christian faith. Before he was made bishop of Sebastia, he was a physician who possessed wonderful healing powers. Miracles, including the cure of diseased beasts during his refuge, account for him being the patron saint of wild animals. He is also venerated as patron of sufferers from throat diseases. Although Christianity had

been adopted about 300 CE as the state religion in Armenia, the Roman emperor Licinius began a persecution of the Christians, and Blaise was discovered and apprehended. While imprisoned, he miraculously cured a boy from fatally choking. After being torn with wool combers of irons, Blaise was beheaded.

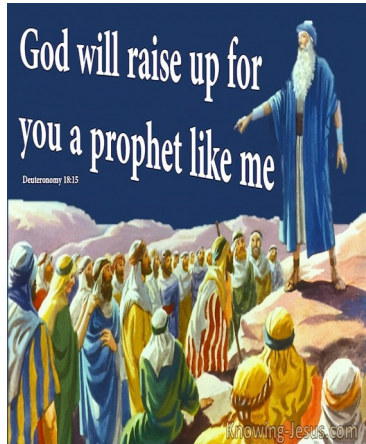


## ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

**LET US NOT AGAIN HEAR THE VOICE OF THE LORD.****DEUT. 18:15-20**

Addressing the Israelites as they are about to enter the Promised Land, Moses recalls what happened when God was about to give them the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. God announced his presence with lightning, thunder, a deafening shofar blast, and menacing dark smoke. Terrified, the people backed away, saying, “Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord!” They begged Moses to go and bring God’s word back to them!

Now, knowing he was not going to be with them much longer, Moses promises that God will send them someone to take his place “a prophet like me...to whom you shall listen”. What a relief! God promises they will never have to endure the trauma of hearing him directly.

And so it was. In every generation, God raised up prophets for the people. Deborah, Elijah, Jeremiah: these and others heard God directly and proclaimed what they heard.

But now, through Jesus, the living “Word” of God, everything has changed. By destroying sin and death, he has opened the pathway for us sinners to come before the all-holy God. Now, every single person can know God personally. Every single person can hear his voice—in Scripture, through Church, and most important, in the depths of their hearts.

You don’t ever have to be afraid of coming into God’s presence! In fact, he is already present in you! Through his Spirit, he is urging you to call out to him, “Abba, Father!” He is waiting to receive you with open arms, to wash you clean in his mercy, and to fill your heart with his joy and consolation.

Your heavenly Father has a message that he wants to speak to you today—a message meant only for you. So quiet your heart, calm your fears, and listen.

*“Here I am, Lord! I long to hear your voice today!”*
