The Story of the Conversion of Saint Paul

Saint Paul's entire life can be explained in terms of one experience—his meeting with Jesus on the road to Damascus. One sentence determined his theology: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5b). Jesus was mysteriously identified with people—the loving group of people Saul had been running down like criminals. Jesus, he saw, was the mysterious fulfillment of all he had been blindly pursuing. From then on, his only work was to "present everyone perfect in Christ. "For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and [with] much conviction" (1 Thessalonians 1:5a). Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message of the cross: Christians die baptismally to sin and are buried with Christ; they are dead to all that is sinful and unredeemed in the world. They are made into a new creation, already sharing Christ's victory and someday to rise from the dead like him. Through this risen Christ the Father pours out the Spirit on them, making them completely new. Paul is undoubtedly hard to understand. His style often reflects the rabbinical style of argument of his day, and often his thought skips on mountaintops while we plod below. But perhaps our problems are accentuated by the fact that so many beautiful jewels have become part of the everyday coin in our Christian language.



La historia de la Conversión de San Pablo

La vida entera de San Pablo se puede explicar en términos de una experiencia: su reunión con Jesús en el camino a Damasco. Una oración determinó su teología: "Yo soy Jesús, a quien tú persigues" (Hechos 9:5b). Jesús se identificó misteriosamente con la gente: el grupo amoroso de personas que Saúl había estado corriendo como criminales. Jesús, vio, era el cumplimiento misterioso de todo lo que había estado persiguiendo ciegamente. A partir de entonces, su único trabajo fue "presentar a todos perfectos en Cristo. "Porque nuestro evangelio no vino a ustedes solo de palabra, sino también en poder y en el Espíritu Santo y [con] mucha convicción" (1 Tesalonicenses 1: 5a). La vida de Pablo se convirtió en una incansable proclamación y vivencia del mensaje de la cruz: los cristianos mueren bautismalmente al pecado y son sepultados con Cristo; están muertos para todo lo que es pecaminoso y no redimido en el mundo. Se convierten en una nueva creación, ya comparten la victoria de Cristo y algún día resucitarán de la muerte como él. A través de este Cristo resucitado, el Padre derrama el Espíritu sobre ellos, haciéndolos completamente nuevos. Pablo es indudablemente difícil de entender. Su estilo a menudo refleja el estilo rabínico de discusión de su época, y a menudo su pensamiento se salta en las cimas de las montañas mientras pisamos abajo. Pero quizás nuestros problemas se acentúan por el hecho de que tantas joyas hermosas se han convertido en parte de la moneda cotidiana en nuestro idioma cristiano.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children": "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade.



Día de Oración por la Protección Legal de los Niños no Nacidos

Los más de 56 millones de abortos desde las decisiones de 1973 de Roe v. Wade y Doe v. Bolton reflejan con una magnitud desgarradora lo que el Papa Francisco quiere decir con una "cultura de usar y tirar". Sin embargo, tenemos una gran confianza en la providencia de Dios. En las Escrituras se nos recuerda una y otra vez que busquemos la ayuda del Señor, y como personas de fe, creemos que nuestras oraciones se escuchan. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano (GIRM), no. 373, designa el 22 de enero como un día particular de oración y penitencia, llamado el "Día de Oración por la Protección Legal de los Niños No Nacidos": "En todas las Diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, el 22 de enero (o el 23 de enero, cuando enero 22 cae un domingo) se observará como un día particular de oración por el restablecimiento total de la garantía legal del derecho a la vida y de la penitencia por violaciones a la dignidad de la persona humana cometida a través de actos de aborto ". Como individuos, estamos llamados a observar este día a través de las prácticas penitenciales de oración, ayuno y / o limosna. Otra forma de participar es participando en eventos especiales para observar el aniversario de Roe v. Wade. .
