**The Story of Our Lady of Fatima**

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos—received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell.

When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

The message of Fatima is simple: Pray.

Unfortunately, some people—not Sister Lucia—have distorted these revelations, making them into an apocalyptic event for which they are now the only reliable interpreters. They have, for example, claimed that Mary's request that the world be consecrated to her has been ignored. Sister Lucia agreed that Pope John Paul II's public consecration in St. Peter's Square on March 25, 1984, fulfilled Mary's request. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith prepared a June 26, 2000, document explaining the "third secret."

Mary is perfectly honored when people generously imitate her response "Let it be done to me as you say" (Luke 1:38). Mary can never be seen as a rival to Jesus or to the Church's teaching authority, as exercised by the college of bishops united with the bishop of Rome.



**La historia de Nuestra Señora de Fátima**

Entre el 13 de mayo y el 13 de octubre de 1917, tres niños portugueses, Francisco y Jacinta Marto y su prima Lucía dos Santos, recibieron apariciones de Nuestra Señora en Cova da Iria, cerca de Fátima, una ciudad a 110 millas al norte de Lisboa. Mary pidió a los niños rezar el rosario por la paz mundial, por el fin de la Primera Guerra Mundial, por los pecadores y por la conversión de Rusia.

Mary les dio a los niños tres secretos. Después de la muerte de Francisco y Jacinta en 1919 y 1920 respectivamente, Lucía reveló el primer secreto en 1927. Se refería a la devoción al Inmaculado Corazón de María. El segundo secreto era una visión del infierno. Cuando Lucía creció, se convirtió en monja carmelita y murió en 2005 a la edad de 97 años.

El Papa Juan Pablo II ordenó al Secretario de Estado de la Santa Sede que revelara el tercer secreto en 2000; hablaba de un "obispo de blanco" que recibió un disparo de un grupo de soldados que dispararon balas y flechas contra él. Muchas personas vincularon esta visión al intento de asesinato contra el Papa Juan Pablo II en la Plaza de San Pedro el 13 de mayo de 1981.

La fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Fátima fue aprobada por el obispo local en 1930; fue agregado al calendario mundial de la Iglesia en 2002.

El mensaje de Fátima es simple: orar.

Desafortunadamente, algunas personas, no la hermana Lucía, han distorsionado estas revelaciones, convirtiéndolas en un evento apocalíptico para el que ahora son los únicos intérpretes confiables. Han afirmado, por ejemplo, que la solicitud de Mary de que el mundo sea consagrado a ella ha sido ignorada.

La Hermana Lucía acordó que la consagración pública del Papa Juan Pablo II en la Plaza de San Pedro el 25 de marzo de 1984, cumplió con la solicitud de María. La Congregación para la Doctrina de la Fe preparó un documento del 26 de junio de 2000 que explica el "tercer secreto".

Mary se siente perfectamente honrada cuando la gente imita generosamente su respuesta "Que se haga a mí como tú dices" (Lucas 1:38). Nunca se puede ver a María como una rival de Jesús o de la autoridad docente de la Iglesia, como lo ejerce el colegio de obispos unidos con el obispo de Roma.
