Saints Peter and Paul's Story

Peter (d. 64?) Saint Mark ends the first half of his Gospel with a triumphant climax. He has recorded doubt, misunderstanding, and the opposition of many to Jesus. Now Peter makes his great confession of faith: "You are the Messiah" (Mark 8:29b). It was one of the many glorious moments in Peter's life, beginning with the day he was called from his nets along the Sea of Galilee to become a fisher of men for Jesus.

The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the apostles, chosen by Jesus to have a special relationship with him. With James and John he was privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of a dead child to life, and the agony in Gethsemane. His mother-in-law was cured by Jesus. He was sent with John to prepare for the last Passover before Jesus' death. His name is first on every list of apostles.

The Risen Jesus told Peter to feed his lambs and his sheep (John 21:15-17).

Paul (d. 64?) If the most well-known preacher today suddenly began preaching that the United States should adopt Marxism and not rely on the Constitution, the angry reaction would help us understand Paul's life when he started preaching that Christ alone can save us. He had been the most pharisaic of Pharisees, the most legalistic of Mosaic lawyers. Now he suddenly appears to other Jews as a heretical welcomer of Gentiles, a traitor and apostate.

Paul's central conviction was simple and absolute: Only God can save humanity. No human effort—even the most scrupulous observance of law—can create a human good which we can bring to God as reparation for sin and payment for grace. To be saved from itself, from sin, from the devil, and from death, humanity must open itself completely to the saving power of Jesus.

We would probably go to confession to Peter sooner than to any of the other apostles. He is perhaps a more striking example of the simple fact of holiness. Jesus says to us as he said, in effect, to Peter: "It is not you who have chosen me, but I who have chosen you. Peter, it is not human wisdom that makes it possible for you to believe, but my Father's revelation. I, not you, build my Church." Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic, and courageous ambassadors of Christ the Church has ever had. But persecution, humiliation, and weakness became his day-by-day carrying of the cross, material for further transformation. The dying Christ was in him; the living Christ was his life.



La historia de los Santos Pedro y Pablo

Peter (d. 64?) San Marcos termina la primera mitad de su Evangelio con un clímax triunfante. Ha registrado dudas, malentendidos y la oposición de muchos a Jesús. Ahora Pedro hace su gran confesión de fe: "Tú eres el Mesías" (Marcos 8: 29b). Fue uno de los muchos momentos gloriosos en la vida de Pedro, comenzando con el día en que fue llamado desde sus redes a lo largo del Mar de Galilea para convertirse en un pescador de hombres para Jesús.

El Nuevo Testamento muestra claramente a Pedro como el líder de los apóstoles, elegido por Jesús para tener una relación especial con él. Con James y John tuvo el privilegio de presenciar la Transfiguración, la resurrección de un niño muerto y la agonía en Getsemani. Su suegra fue curada por Jesús. Fue enviado con Juan para prepararse para la última Pascua antes de la muerte de Jesús. Su nombre es el primero en cada lista de apóstoles.

Jesús resucitado le dijo a Pedro que alimentara a sus corderos y sus ovejas (Juan 21: 15-17).

Paul (d. 64?) Si el predicador más conocido hoy de repente comenzó a predicar que Estados Unidos debería adoptar el marxismo y no confiar en la Constitución, la reacción de enojo nos ayudaría a entender la vida de Paul cuando comenzó a predicar que solo Cristo puede salvarnos. Había sido el fariseo más fariseo, el más legalista de los abogados mosaicos. Ahora, de repente, se le aparece a otros judíos como un herético bienvenido de gentiles, un traidor y un apóstata.

La convicción central de Pablo era simple y absoluta: solo Dios puede salvar a la humanidad. Ningún esfuerzo humano, incluso la observancia más escrupulosa de la ley, puede crear un bien humano que podamos traer a Dios como reparación por el pecado y pago por la gracia.

Para ser salvada de sí misma, del pecado, del diablo y de la muerte, la humanidad debe abrirse por completo al poder salvador de Jesús.

Probablemente iríamos a confesarnos con Pedro antes que con cualquiera de los otros apóstoles. Es quizás un ejemplo más llamativo del simple hecho de la santidad. Jesús nos dice como dijo, en efecto, a Pedro: "No eres tú quien me ha elegido a mí, sino yo quien te ha elegido a ti. Peter, no es la sabiduría humana lo que te permite creer, sino la revelación de mi Padre. Yo, no tú, construyo mi Iglesia. La experiencia de Pablo del Jesús resucitado en el camino a Damasco fue la fuerza motriz que lo convirtió en uno de los embajadores más celosos, dinámicos y valientes de Cristo que la Iglesia haya tenido. Pero la persecución, la humillación y la debilidad se convirtieron en su carga diaria de la cruz, material para una mayor transformación. El Cristo moribundo estaba en él; El Cristo viviente era su vida.

Announcements

Starting this Monday, the 29th, we will resume our normal hours of Church and Mass. Therefore, the daily 8:00AM mass will resume as normal, Thursday, July 2nd there will be the rosary and Spanish mass at 7:30PM, Friday, July 3rd, we will have the Adoration after the 8:00AM mass and Adoration in Spanish at 7:00PM.

A partir de este lunes 29, reanudaremos nuestras horas normales de Iglesia y Misa. Con respecto a la misa del domingo, a partir del 5 de julio, las misa portuguesa y inglesa serán al mismo horario. La misa en español se dividirá en dos misas, una el sábado por la noche a las 7:30 p.m. y otra el domingo por la mañana a las 11:15 a.m.
