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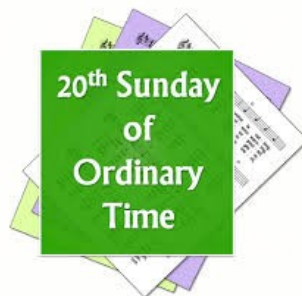

Saint Pius X's Story

Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children.

The second of 10 children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto became Pius X at age 68. He was one of the 20th century's greatest popes.

Ever mindful of his humble origin, Pope Pius stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor." He was embarrassed by some of the pomp of the papal court. "Look how they have dressed me up," he said in tears to an old friend. To another, "It is a penance to be forced to accept all these practices. They lead me around surrounded by soldiers like Jesus when he was seized in Gethsemani."

Interested in politics, Pope Pius encouraged Italian Catholics to become more politically involved. One of his first papal acts was to end the supposed right of governments to interfere by veto in papal elections—a practice that reduced the freedom of the 1903 conclave which had elected him.

In 1905, when France renounced its agreement with the Holy See and threatened confiscation of Church property if governmental control of Church affairs were not granted, Pius X courageously rejected the demand.

While he did not author a famous social encyclical as his predecessor had done, he denounced the ill treatment of indigenous peoples on the plantations of Peru, sent a relief commission to Messina after an earthquake, and sheltered refugees at his own expense.

On the 11th anniversary of his election as pope, Europe was plunged into World War I. Pius had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me. I would gladly give my life to save my poor children from this ghastly scourge." He died a few weeks after the war began, and was canonized in 1954.

His humble background was no obstacle in relating to a personal God and to people whom he loved genuinely. Pius X gained his strength, his gentleness and warmth for people from the source of all gifts, the Spirit of Jesus. In contrast, we often feel embarrassed by our backgrounds. Shame makes us prefer to remain aloof from people whom we perceive as superior. If we are in a superior position, on the other hand, we often ignore simpler people.

Yet we, too, have to help "restore all things in Christ," especially the wounded people of God.

La historia de San Pío X

El Papa Pío X es quizás mejor recordado por alentar la recepción frecuente de la Sagrada Comunión, especialmente por parte de los niños.

Joseph Sarto, el segundo de 10 hijos de una familia italiana pobre, se convirtió en Pío X a la edad de 68 años. Fue uno de los papas más grandes del siglo XX. Siempre consciente de su origen humilde, el Papa Pío declaró: "Nací pobre, viví pobre, moriré pobre". Estaba avergonzado por parte de la pompa de la corte papal. "Mira cómo me han vestido", le dijo entre lágrimas a un viejo amigo. Para otro, "Es una penitencia verse obligado a aceptar todas estas prácticas. Me llevan rodeado de soldados como Jesús cuando lo apresaron en Getsemani".

Interesado en la política, el Papa Pío animó a los católicos italianos a involucrarse más políticamente. Uno de sus primeros actos papales fue poner fin al supuesto derecho de los gobiernos a interferir por veto en las elecciones papales, una práctica que redujo la libertad del cónclave de 1903 que lo había elegido. En 1905, cuando Francia renunció a su acuerdo con la Santa Sede y amenazó con confiscar los bienes de la Iglesia si no se concedía el control gubernamental de los asuntos de la Iglesia, Pío X rechazó valientemente la demanda. Si bien no escribió una famosa encíclica social como lo había hecho su predecesor, denunció los malos tratos a los pueblos indígenas en las plantaciones de Perú, envió una comisión de socorro a Messina después de un terremoto y dio refugio a refugiados por su cuenta.

En el undécimo aniversario de su elección como Papa, Europa se sumergió en la Primera Guerra Mundial. Pío lo había previsto, pero lo mató. "Esta es la última aflicción que el Señor visitará sobre mí. Con mucho gusto daría mi vida para salvar a mis pobres hijos de este espantoso flagelo". Murió pocas semanas después de que comenzara la guerra y fue canonizado en 1954. Su origen humilde no fue obstáculo para relacionarse con un Dios personal y con las personas a quienes amaba genuinamente. Pío X ganó su fuerza, su gentileza y calidez para las personas de la fuente de todos los dones, el Espíritu de Jesús. En contraste, a menudo nos sentimos avergonzados por nuestros antecedentes. La vergüenza nos hace preferir mantenernos alejados de las personas a las que percibimos como superiores.

Si estamos en una posición superior, por el contrario, a menudo ignoramos a las personas más sencillas. Sin embargo, nosotros también tenemos que ayudar a "restaurar todas las cosas en Cristo", especialmente al pueblo herido de Dios.
