Saint Bonaventure's Story

Historia de San Buenaventura

Perhaps not a household name for most people, Saint Bonaventure, nevertheless, played an important role in both the medieval Church and the history of the Franciscan Order. A senior faculty member at the University of Paris, Saint Bonaventure certainly captured the hearts of his students through his academic skills and insights. But more importantly, he captured their hearts through his Franciscan love for Jesus and the Church. Like his model, Saint Francis, Jesus was the center of everything—his teaching, his administration, his writing, and his life. So much so, that he was given the title “Seraphic Doctor.” Born in Bagnorea in 1221, Saint Bonaventure was baptized John, but received the name Bonaventure when he became a Franciscan at the age of 22. Little is known about his childhood, but we do know that his parents were Giovanni di Fidanza and Maria Ritell. It seems that his father was a physician and a man of means. While Saint Francis died about five years after the saint’s birth, he is credited with healing Bonaventure as a boy of a serious illness. Saint Bonaventure’s teaching career came to a halt when the Friars elected him to serve as their General Minister. His 17 years of service were not easy as the Order was embroiled in conflicts over the interpretation of poverty. Some friars even ended up in heresy saying that Saint Francis and his community were inaugurating the era of the Holy Spirit which was to replace Jesus, the Church, and Scripture. But because he was a man of prayer and a good administrator, Saint Bonaventure managed to structure the Order through effective legislation. But more importantly, he offered the Friars an organized spirituality based on the vision and insights of Saint Francis. Always a Franciscan at heart and a mystical writer, Bonaventure managed to unite the pastoral, practical aspects of life with the doctrines of the Church. Thus, there is a noticeable warmth to his teachings and writings that make him very appealing. Shortly before he ended his service as General Minister, Pope Gregory X created him a Cardinal and appointed him bishop of Albano. But a little over a year later, while participating in the Second Council of Lyon, Saint Bonaventure suddenly died on July 15, 1274. There is a theory that he was poisoned. Saint Bonaventure left behind a structured and renewed Franciscan Order and a body of work all of which glorifies his major love—Jesus.


Quizás no sea un nombre familiar para la mayoría de la gente, San Buenaventura, sin embargo, jugó un papel importante tanto en la Iglesia medieval como en la historia de la Orden Franciscana. Saint Bonaventure, miembro senior de la facultad de la Universidad de París, ciertamente capturó los corazones de sus estudiantes a través de sus habilidades y conocimientos académicos. Pero lo que es más importante, capturó sus corazones a través de su amor franciscano por Jesús y la Iglesia. Como su modelo, San Francisco, Jesús fue el centro de todo: su enseñanza, su administración, su escritura y su vida. Tanto es así, que le dieron el título de "Doctor Seráfico". Nacido en Bagnorea en 1221, San Buenaventura fue bautizado como Juan, pero recibió el nombre de Buenaventura cuando se hizo franciscano a los 22 años. Poco se sabe de su infancia, pero sí sabemos que sus padres fueron Giovanni di Fidanza y Maria Ritell. Parece que su padre era médico y hombre de recursos. Si bien San Francisco murió unos cinco años después del nacimiento del santo, se le atribuye la curación de Buenaventura cuando era un niño de una enfermedad grave. La carrera docente de san Buenaventura se detuvo cuando los frailes lo eligieron como ministro general. Sus 17 años de servicio no fueron fáciles ya que la Orden se vio envuelta en conflictos sobre la interpretación de la pobreza. Algunos frailes incluso terminaron en herejía diciendo que San Francisco y su comunidad inauguraban la era del Espíritu Santo que reemplazaría a Jesús, la Iglesia y la Escritura. Pero por ser un hombre de oración y un buen administrador, san Buenaventura logró estructurar la Orden mediante una legislación eficaz. Pero, lo que es más importante, ofreció a los frailes una espiritualidad organizada basada en la visión y las intuiciones de San Francisco. Siempre franciscano de corazón y escritor místico, Buenaventura logró unir los aspectos pastorales y prácticos de la vida con las doctrinas de la Iglesia. Por lo tanto, hay una calidez notable en sus enseñanzas y escritos que lo hacen muy atractivo. Poco antes de terminar su servicio como ministro general, el papa Gregorio X lo nombró cardenal y lo nombró obispo de Albano. Pero poco más de un año después, mientras participaba en el Segundo Concilio de Lyon, San Buenaventura murió repentinamente el 15 de julio de 1274. Existe la teoría de que fue envenenado. San Buenaventura dejó una Orden Franciscana estructurada y renovada y un cuerpo de trabajo que glorifica su mayor amor: Jesús.
