Saint Mary Magdalene's Story

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. Yet she could well be the patron of the slandered, since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36-50. Most Scripture scholars today point out that there is no scriptural basis for confusing the two women. Mary Magdalene, that is, "of Magdala," was the one from whom Christ cast out "seven demons" (Luke 8:2)—an indication at the worst, of extreme demonic possession or possibly, severe illness. Writing in the New Catholic Commentary, Father Wilfrid J. Harrington, O.P., says that "seven demons" "does not mean that Mary had lived an immoral life—a conclusion reached only by means of a mistaken identification with the anonymous woman of Luke 7:36." In the Jerome Biblical Commentary, Father Edward Mally, S.J., agrees that she "is not...the same as the sinner of Luke 7:37, despite the later Western romantic tradition about her." Mary Magdalene was one of the many "who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means." She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the "official" witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles."



Reflection

Mary Magdalene has been a victim of mistaken identity for almost 20 centuries. Yet she would no doubt insist that it makes no difference. We are all sinners in need of the saving power of God, whether our sins have been lurid or not. More importantly, we are all "unofficial" witnesses of the Resurrection.

Historia de Santa María Magdalena

A excepción de la madre de Jesús, pocas mujeres son más honradas en la Biblia que María Magdalena. Sin embargo, ella bien podría ser la patrona de los calumniados, ya que ha habido una leyenda persistente en la Iglesia de que ella es la mujer pecadora sin nombre que ungió los pies de Jesús en Lucas 7: 36-50. La mayoría de los estudiosos de las Escrituras de hoy señalan que no existe una base bíblica para confundir a las dos mujeres. María Magdalena, es decir, "de Magdala", fue de quien Cristo echó "siete demonios" (Lucas 8: 2), una indicación en el peor de los casos, de posesión demoníaca extrema o posiblemente, enfermedad grave. Escribiendo en el New Catholic Commentary, el padre Wilfrid J. Harrington, OP, dice que "siete demonios" "no significa que María había vivido una vida inmoral, una conclusión a la que se llegó sólo mediante una identificación errónea con la mujer anónima de Lucas 7". : 36 ". En el Comentario bíblico de Jerome, el padre Edward Mally, S.J., está de acuerdo en que ella "no es ... la misma que la pecadora de Lucas 7:37, a pesar de la tradición romántica occidental posterior sobre ella". María Magdalena fue una de las muchas "que les estaban ayudando [a Jesús ya los Doce] fuera de sus posibilidades". Ella fue una de las que estuvieron junto a la cruz de Jesús con su madre. Y, de todos los testigos "oficiales" que pudieron haber sido elegidos para la primera toma de conciencia de la Resurrección, ella fue a quien se le otorgó ese privilegio. Se la conoce como la "Apóstol de los Apóstoles".

Reflexión

María Magdalena ha sido víctima de un error de identidad durante casi 20 siglos. Sin embargo, sin duda insistiría en que no hay ninguna diferencia. Todos somos pecadores que necesitamos el poder salvador de Dios, ya sea que nuestros pecados hayan sido espeluznantes o no. Más importante aún, todos somos testigos "no oficiales" de la Resurrección.
