The Story of Our Lady of Sorrows

For a while there were two feasts in honor of the Sorrowful Mother: one going back to the 15th century, the other to the 17th century. For a while both were celebrated by the universal Church: one on the Friday before Palm Sunday, the other in September.

The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple.

Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

Saint Ambrose in particular sees Mary as a sorrowful yet powerful figure at the cross. Mary stood fearlessly at the cross while others fled. Mary looked on her Son's wounds with pity, but saw in them the salvation of the world. As Jesus hung on the cross, Mary did not fear to be killed, but offered herself to her persecutors.

Reflection

John's account of Jesus' death is highly symbolic. When Jesus gives the beloved disciple to Mary, we are invited to appreciate Mary's role in the Church: She symbolizes the Church; the beloved disciple represents all believers. As Mary mothered Jesus, she is now mother to all his followers. Furthermore, as Jesus died, he handed over his Spirit. Mary and the Spirit cooperate in begetting new children of God—almost an echo of Luke's account of Jesus' conception. Christians can trust that they will continue to experience the caring presence of Mary and Jesus' Spirit throughout their lives and throughout history.



La historia de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores

Durante un tiempo hubo dos fiestas en honor a la Madre Dolorosa: una que se remonta al siglo XV y la otra al siglo XVII. Durante un tiempo ambos fueron celebrados por la Iglesia universal: uno el viernes anterior al Domingo de Ramos, el otro en septiembre.

Las principales referencias bíblicas a los dolores de María se encuentran en Lucas 2:35 y Juan 19:26-27. El pasaje de Lucas es la predicción de Simeón sobre una espada que atraviesa el alma de María; el pasaje joánico relata las palabras de Jesús desde la cruz a María y al discípulo amado.

Muchos escritores de la Iglesia primitiva interpretan la espada como el dolor de María, especialmente cuando vio a Jesús morir en la cruz. Por lo tanto, los dos pasajes se unen como predicción y cumplimiento.

San Ambrosio, en particular, ve a María como una figura dolorosa pero poderosa en la cruz. María se paró sin miedo en la cruz mientras otros huían. María miró las heridas de su Hijo con lástima, pero vio en ellas la salvación del mundo. Mientras Jesús colgaba de la cruz, María no temió que la mataran, sino que se ofreció a sus perseguidores.

Reflexión

El relato de Juan sobre la muerte de Jesús es muy simbólico. Cuando Jesús entrega el discípulo amado a María, se nos invita a apreciar el papel de María en la Iglesia: simboliza la Iglesia; el discípulo amado representa a todos los creyentes. Como María dio a luz a Jesús, ahora es madre de todos sus seguidores. Además, cuando Jesús murió, entregó su Espíritu. María y el Espíritu cooperan para engendrar nuevos hijos de Dios, casi un eco del relato de Lucas sobre la concepción de Jesús. Los cristianos pueden confiar en que seguirán experimentando la presencia solidaria de María y el Espíritu de Jesús a lo largo de sus vidas y a lo largo de la historia.
